HIRAM ABI

AN EXPLANATION OF SOME OF THE SYMBOLOGY SURROUNDING THE MASTER ARCHITECT

The Enigma of Hiram is the Mystery of Creation, but in order for that statement to make sense, it must be known what the symbol represents. In this, I will challenge some of the statements made by Pike in reference to the meaning of his name, and this is done because I have noticed some authors forget a very important step in their inquiries. I have seen that, although all recognize that existence of at least 3 to 4 different languages being used throughout the degrees, few have considered the meanings of the words contained therein as they are known to the opposing languages. An example is the word Amun, which in Ancient Egyptian means "the Hidden One", or "the invisible", but in Ancient Hebrew Amun translates to "Mason". These two concepts correlate, as the work of a Freemason is done in "Silence", which is to say, "in secret". This alludes to the "Hidden" Nature of the word in Egyptian, but when coupled with the Hebrew, it produces a new meaning, that of "The Hidden Builder, The Hidden Architect". If this can happen with a word such as Amun, imagine what happens when we do the same thing with the name Hiram, and it gives reason to the existence of Ptah (the hidden god) in the Degrees of the Scottish Rite.

According to Ill Manly P. Hall, in his work *The Lost Keys of Freemasonry*, he mentions the first appearance of the name Hiram, which actually appears in its Chaldaic form of Chiram. This is located atop the Emerald Tablet of Thot with the large print words, which reads, "The Secret Work: Chiram the Universal Agent, One in Essence, but Three in Aspect". I have no reason to disagree with his translation other than changing the last word to "Form" or "Being", but that is irrelevant to the whole.

This is important because we know through History that the Chaldeans were in fact intimate with the Ancient Egyptians and that the Hebrews got much of their alphabet and language from the Chaldeans. This is a well explored aspect in Freemasonry, but others are more than welcome to explore the topic further on their own time. This would also mean that the Priest Class would have, at some point, have come in contact with one another, which is evident from the Mysteries associated with both groups having almost identical teachings and symbols,

which would imply the transference of information between the two groups. This begs the question: What does the word Hiram mean in Ancient Egyptian?

Hiram in Ancient Egyptian would have been phonetically spelt as Khuram, or Khurum, which is the same phonetics associated with the Hebrew saying of the name, and this is also noted by Pike, but not via the avenue of Egyptian linguistics, as he only looks at the Hebrew and Samaritan versions of the name. In Ancient Egyptian, this word is broken up syllabically as Khu-ram, or Khu-rum. Taking these syllables as pieces to a puzzle, they give the concepts of Immortality and Creation, as Khu (Akhu) means "the Immortal, Radiant, and Shinning part of Man that lives on in the Sahu (another part of the Soul), which carries the Intellect, Will, and Intentions into the afterlife through the transmutation of Death". The next is the Ram/Rum, of which is a nod to the god Amun, who took the Form of a Ram, and is said to represent the Creative Essence "hidden within the cosmos". There are three things to consider here; the fact that it is through the Transmutation of Death which makes the *Khu* conscious in the afterlife, the *Ram*, and the relationship with Amun all being present in these syllables, and these form the meaning of Hiram in his symbolic nature.

The *Transmutation of Death* is an allusion to overcoming the material nature of Life, it having no more sway over you. This is shown with the Death of Hiram and is hidden in the "Jewel of his Office", it being the Plumb, the symbol for *Resurrection & Ascension*, which is shown with the fact that it measures the Sun in its course through the seasons, it Ascending upwards after the Winter Solstice (symbol for Death), thus "conquering" Death, or Transmuting Death into Immortality (*Sol Invictus*).

The connection with *Amun* has already been shown, but to be clearer, it here carries the meaning or both Mason (Architect) and the Hidden One, they being synonymous terms in the Mysteries. The *Ram* is the Egyptian version of the *Lamb* which takes away the "sins of the world", which gives the meaning of the "Sacrificial Lamb" found in the Christian Scriptures.

By using both languages, it becomes clear that the meaning of Hiram is very much known, it being the *Resurrecting Immortal Spirit* of Creation, the Hidden Architect of Creation, and the Hidden Immortal Flame of Creation or Light Behind/Within the Darkness.
